Blood Test Results

Please can we remind all patients that it is their responsibility to contact the practice to obtain blood test results at least five working days after the appointment. Patients who have an NHS Account or the NHS App will be able to view their own blood test results online. Unfortunately due to the huge volume of blood tests that we undertake we cannot contact all patients with their results, but we do follow up any urgent results with patients.

From 1st July

All appointments with a GP will be for 15 minutes, this is to try and reduce the need for repeated consultations while still preserving quality of care and patient satisfaction.

NHS Account / NHS App

- Order repeat prescriptions
- View your health record

Hayfever BE PREPARED

Hayfever season starts around March with tree, grass and weed pollen. Symptoms of hay fever include:

- sneezing and coughing
- a runny or blocked nose
- itchy, red or watery eyes
- itchy throat, mouth, nose and ears
- loss of smell
- pain around your temples and forehead
- Headache
- Earache
- feeling tired If you have asthma You might also:
- have a tight feeling in your chest
- be short of breath
- wheeze and cough

Hay fever will last for weeks or months, unlike a cold, which usually goes away after 1 to 2 weeks. There are many over the counter remedies for hayfever, please ask your pharmacist for advice as to what will help best with your symptoms. You only need to see the GP if your symptoms are not helped by medicines from the pharmacy.

Please do help your GP Practice and seek the help of a local pharmacist first for any of the following conditions.

For any minor ailments which include: Hayfever, cold sores, stings with minor redness, cystitis, infant colic, conjunctivitis, blocked or runny nose, mouth ulcers, oral thrush, vaginal itch, athletes foot, blisters, mild skin rashes, heartburn, nappy rash, warts and ringworm.

Risks and Prevention

- Start exercising: This reduces the risks of: Diabetes, Heart Disease, Falls, Depression, Joint and Back Pain and many Cancers
- At the same time become Weight Aware Increasing weight above a BMI of 25 increases your risks of: Heart Disease, Stroke, Diabetes, many Cancers, including Breast Cancer, Bowel Cancer and Oesophageal (gullet) Cancer
- Stop smoking (there is no safe level)
- Watch your alcohol intake Men and women are advised not to drink more than 14 units a week on a regular basis
- Check your Blood Pressure Know your numbers! The BHF says: "Unless your doctor says otherwise, blood pressure should be below 140/90". https://www.bhf.org.uk/ informationsupport/heart-mattersmagazine/medical/highblood-pressure-latest-news
- Ask for your NHS health check if you are aged 40 to 75





IMMUNISATIONS

Are you up to date??

The World Health Organisation have predicted a rise in measles cases across Europe in 2023, making it more important than ever to make sure that children are fully protected.

Parents, please check if your children are up to date with their MMR vaccines to protect them against measles, mumps and rubella. To become fully protected, children need two doses, the first at age one year and the second at 3 years 4 months and up to the age of 5.

The NHS offers a range of vaccinations for people from birth into older age to safely protect them against potentially serious illnesses.

Keeping up to date with routine vaccinations is essential in preventing severe illnesses amongst all age groups.

As well as protecting you and the people around you, vaccinations also help the NHS by reducing the number of people that are likely to get seriously ill from catching a virus and needing to go to hospital.

Vaccinations are rigorously tested to the highest safety standards.

As with many medications, people may have some side effects when having a vaccination. This is perfectly normal and usually quite mild.

Antibiotic Awareness Keep Antibiotics Effective

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REMEMBER

• Antibiotics won't work in case of a cold or flu.

ANTIBIOTICS

- Take antibiotics responsibly and only when they are prescribed by your doctor.
- Keeping antibiotics effective is everybody's responsibility.
- Follow your doctors advice on when and how to take them
- Don't use "left-over" antibiotics.
- Ask your doctor or your pharmacist about how to dispose of any remaining antibiotics.
- Responsible use of antibiotics can help stop resistant bacteria.
- Stopping resistant bacteria will keep antibiotics effective for the use of future generations.
- Do not take antibiotics without a doctor's prescription.
- If you have a cold or flu and your doctor decides that you do not need antibiotics, take care of yourself in order to get better.
